Results

- 48% strongly agree/agree that the school does a good job communicating with parents.
- 64% 46% strongly agree/agree that the teachers do a good job keeping them informed about how well their child is doing in school.
- 73% 69% are always/usually comfortable helping their children with homework.

- 92% --- have access to the school website.
- 94% 50% are comfortable using the school website (to look at their child's grades).
- 90% 86% strongly agree/agree that they have a good understanding in how to support their child to do their best at school.
- 86% 76% strongly agree/agree that they feel welcomed when they visit their child's school.
- 84% 78% strongly agree/agree that they feel welcomed when they visit with their child's teacher.
- 71% 79% strongly agree/agree that their child holds the key to their educational success.
- 21% 22% strongly agree/agree that the school is fully responsible for the success of their child's education.
- 54% 44% will always/usually contact the teacher when their child needs more help than they can give them.
- 97% 92% strongly agree/agree that being active in their child's education will help them be more successful in school.
- 92% 80% talk to their child daily about their school day.
- 19% believe there are always/usually opportunities for them to be involved in the classroom.
- 83% --- are aware that there are ways to participate as a volunteer in the school district.
- 51% 38% strongly agree/agree the school does a good job of encouraging parent involvement.
- 75% 69% strongly agree/agree that their child has a positive experience at school.
- 97% 92% strongly agree/agree that their support can make a significant difference in their child's education.
- 74% 71% believe teachers always/usually seem to care about the students.
- 86% 96% are comfortable approaching teachers with their ideas and concerns.
- 56% 68% are comfortable approaching principals with their ideas and concerns.
- 45% 39% are comfortable approaching the superintendent with their ideas and concerns.
- 38% 34% are comfortable approaching school board members with their ideas and concerns.
- 60% 56% strongly agree/agree that they can count of the school's support when they have concerns about their child.
- 71% 61% strongly agree/agree that the school does an excellent job in helping their child acquire skills and knowledge in **reading**.
- 57% 47% strongly agree/agree that the school does an excellent job in helping their child acquire skills and knowledge in **mathematics**.
- 67% 57% strongly agree/agree that the school does an excellent job in helping their child acquire skills and knowledge in **science**.
